# 2026 Nebraska Community College Association (NCCA) Budget Review

Board members reviewed the proposed 2026 NCCA budget. At the conclusion of discussion, Chair Stinner noted that concerns will be addressed at the NCCA third quarter meeting scheduled August 11<sup>th</sup> in Lincoln.

## **Board Training – HLC Quality Initiative**

President Dart reported the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) expects accredited institutions to continuously engage in quality improvement. This is a standing expectation to maintain accreditation status. The ongoing quality improvement requires each institution to designate one major improvement effort as its quality initiative. The quality initiative serves to demonstrate a commitment to institutional innovation and measurable, outcome-based improvement.

The Quality Initiative should be tailored to meet the institution's current concerns or aspirations. The HLC encourages institutions to use the Quality Initiative to take risks, innovate, take on a tough challenge, or pursue a yet unproven strategy or hypothesis. Thus, partial success or even failure to achieve the goals of the project is acceptable; an institution may learn as much from failure as it does from success.

During the four-year assurance argument for WNCC, section 4.C. was found to be "met with concerns." 4.C. states "The institution pursues educational improvement through goals and strategies to improve retention, persistence, and completion rates in its degree and certificate programs."

This is less about the College's retention and completion rates and more about having identified goals that are appropriate for the institution, measuring progress through the systematic review of data, and tying planning and resource allocation to achievement of goals. An interim monitoring report is required by September 1, 2026. Significant work is already occurring in the Strategic Enrollment Management Committee, and next steps will be discussed soon.

The College has established strong structures for both curricular and co-curricular assessment, as well as program review. The next critical step is to actively utilize the data gathered through these processes to enhance academic programs, guide decision-making, and provide the best possible educational experience for WNCC students.
