In November, the WCCA Board of Governors selected and approved Dr. Carmen Simone to become the sixth president of Western Nebraska Community College.

Simone was selected by the Board of Governors following an extensive, nation-wide search. An 18-person search committee consisting of Board members, WNCC employees, community members, and a WNCC student


sifted through 43 applicants to find Simone.

"I felt like I was coming home when I landed on campus," Simone said. "It was a fantastic visit and I know I've found the right place for myself and family to be." Dr. Simone came to WNCC from the University of South Dakota Community College for Sioux Falls, where she served as the founding vice president and dean. Before taking that position, Simone spent five years as the president of Trinidad State Junior College, a multi-campus, Hispanic-serving institution in rural southern Colorado. While in Colorado, Simone was trained as a peer reviewer with the Higher Learning Commission, one of six regional accreditation agencies for higher education. She has also served as provost and vice president for Academic Affairs at Lewis-Clark State College in Idaho.

She began her career at Casper College in Wyoming, starting as a faculty member before advancing to faculty senate chair, division chair, and vice president for Academic Affairs. She has a Ph.D. in Chemistry from Colorado State University, and a Bachelor's in Chemistry from the University of North Dakota.

Western Nebraska native Justin Kane Hanshew was active in sports in school, performed in musicals, and has always had a strong love of music. After high school, he spent nine years in the Navy, where he served two tours of duty.

After his time in the military and with a family to provide for, Justin worked full time but wanted to expand his opportunities even more. He signed up for classes at WNCC and with the help of the TRIO Veterans Upward Bound program, he was able to secure his degree in 2014.

"I never would have been able to start, let alone finish my degree if it were not for Chris Wolf, and the Veterans Upward Bound program," he said. "I will forever be thankful to her and her crew for all that they do for our veterans."



One of the Western Nebraska Community College Foundation's services is providing money to the Student Emergency Fund. The fund is designated for students who encounter an emergency situation which could potentially affect the student's ability to complete their program of study.

WNCC's vision statement states that we strive to positively impact the education and well-being of every student. The Student Emergency Fund directly helps fulfill this mission. The fund allows the Foundation to give up to \$20,000 a year. Most applicants are referred by WNCC faculty and staff and the Foundation is able to meet student emergency needs – usually within 24-48 hours.

During the 2018-19 fiscal year, Student Emergency Fund money was given to 19 students. Their individual stories are as varied as our student body. One such instance was a single mom working during the day to provide for herself and her family, and attending night classes. She found that the cost of childcare while she was in class was more than her income could cover. The Student Emergency Fund paid for her childcare while she attended class at night.

It is inspirational to see the courage the student shows as they ask for help, their gratitude for the help, and the resolve to complete their education.

Another way WNCC helps students in need is through the Cougar Cupboard, a food pantry that opened in December 2018. In the first 12 months, 56 individuals used the pantry on 100 different occasions. Recently, a generous donor donated a much needed refrigerator to help further the important work of the food pantry. At a recent basketball game, almost 200 items were donated.
